The dreaded DBQ, or "document-based question," is an essay question type on the AP History exams (AP US History, AP European History, and AP World History). For the DBQ essay, you will be asked to analyze some historical issue or trend with the aid of the provided sources, or "documents," as evidence.

### Document Based Question (DBQ)

Document Based Questions (DBQ) assess the ability of each student to work with historical sources in multiple forms. The secondary DBQ will have a maximum of 8 documents; at least 2 of which will be visuals. The 7/8 assessment will have a DBQ with 4 documents (including 2 visuals).

Long story short, DBQ Essay or "Document Based Question" is an assigned academic paper which is part of the AP U.S. History exam (APUSH) set by the United States College Board. It requires a student's knowledge of a certain topic with evidence from around 3 to 16 reliable sources.

### How To Answer A Document Based Question

This activity is based upon a Document-Based Question ("DBQ"), which is an assessment method commonly used in upper division and advanced placement courses. In a DBQ, students are presented with 6-10 documents from varied sources, and are asked to synthesize the documents with their own knowledge to write a coherent thesis-driven essay.

### The Civil Rights Movement: A Document-Based Question ...

This exam consists of 55 multiple-choice questions, four short-answer questions, a longer essay with a choice of two prompts, and a special type of essay question: the Document Based Question, or DBQ.

### How to Ace the DBQ on the AP US History Exam

Students in Jennifer Gilrein's World History class give each other feedback on their Document-Based Questions. Before sharing their DBQs with peers, students set goals to focus the feedback they will solicit. Jennifer encourages students to use the AP DBQ rubric to guide their goal setting and feedback. Students then work together to give each other warm and cool feedback on each others' essays.
