Principles of Islamic jurisprudence, also known as uṣūl al-fiqh (Arabic: **هــقـفـلـا لـوـصـأ** , lit. roots of fiqh), are traditional methodological principles used in Islamic jurisprudence (fiqh) for deriving the rulings of Islamic law (sharia). Traditional theory of Islamic jurisprudence elaborates how the scriptures (Quran and hadith) should be interpreted from the standpoint of linguistics and rhetoric.

Islamic Jurisprudence [FIQH] Fiqh, the term for Islamic jurisprudence, is a process by means of which jurists derive sets of guidelenes, rules and regulations from the rulings laid down in the Qur'an and the teachings and living example of the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh), the Sunnah. Over the centuries, these have been formulated and elaborated upon by successive generations of learned jurists, through interpretation, analogy, consensus and disciplined research.

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Islamic Jurisprudence & Law Islamic law is oftentimes used as a synonym for sharia. However, we must understand this Islamic law to be a law created by men, and not the law of God which itself is perforce unknown and unknowable. In fact, the Arabic term sharia literally means “path,” and is used in the Quran to refer to God’s law.

Islamic jurisprudence is a system of legal theory and practice, known as fiqh, which is based on the sacred law, or sharia, derived directly from the Quran, the Sunnah, and the Old Testament. These original source materials have been expanded and interpreted by Islamic legal scholars and teachers.

Overall, the main focus of Muslim jurists has been the interpretation of scripture. Classical Sunni Islamic jurisprudence has at its heart a theory of four "roots," or bases, of the law, generally listed as (1) the Koran, (2) the Sunna of the Prophet Muhammad, (3) consensus (ijma'), and (4) legal analogy (qiyas).
